On the Riders next possession, Victor would again answer for another touchdown. His third touchdown came right before the end of the first quarter. This would give the Riders a commanding 21 – 0 lead. Mason Bond would also get into the act as he hit Jason Tilley in the end zone for another score.

As the offense was lighting up the score board, the defense had their own game plan in full gear. The plan was to shut out the Hornets offense. The relentless pass rush of Brent Miller and Justin Williamson would account for a total of six sacks on the evening.
