SUBJECT: NCLB Report Card

Section 1111(h)(2) of the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) requires that each LEA that received Title I, Part A funding to disseminate specific LEA (district) and campus level data to (1) all LEA campuses, (2) parents of all enrolled students, and (3) to make the information widely available through public means such as posting on the Internet, distribution to the media, or distribution through public agencies.

1. The School Report Card distributed in the Fall of 2008, included assessment results in the aggregate and disaggregated by race, ethnicity, English proficiency, and economically disadvantaged: by performance level; showing two-year trend data for each subject and grade tested; with a comparison between annual objectives and actual performance for each student group; and including the percentage of each group of students not tested. Percentage of males and females meeting the standard on the TAKS in 2008 are listed below. This percentage is based on the sum of all grades tested, excluding the TAKS-M.

Currently there are no migrant eligible students attending Boys Ranch ISD.

2. The School Report Card distributed in the Fall of 2008, includes graduation rates for secondary school students.
3. Boys Ranch ISD met AYP. Each of the campuses in the district also met AYP. This information is found on the TYP section of the School Report Card that was distributed in the fall of 2008.
4. There are no Title I schools in this district identified as in need of improvement.

5. The percentage of teachers in this district teaching with emergency or provisional credentials is 2%, and the percentage of classes in this district that are not taught by highly qualified teachers is 3%. Because this district is a single attendance district, a comparison between high- and low-poverty schools does not apply.
